The only candidates who signed up to run for our three city council seats were the guys who currently hold them. With no challengers, the incumbents will be automatically elected to new four year terms, but we will still be asking you to **vote in a special referendum** regarding package sales in our city. Here is the ballot question you will be asked to decide: *Shall the issuance of licenses for the package sale of distilled spirits be approved?* Early voting starts Monday, October 16 and runs through Thursday, November 2 at City Hall between 11:00 AM and 4:00 PM. Election Day is Tuesday, November 7 and the polls will be open at City Hall from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. This represents a serious commitment on their part to our community well-being, and we all appreciate it.

Please join us **at City Hall on October 28 for Take Back Drugs Day**. If you have unused prescriptions, you can avoid flushing them which, for those on sewer, sends them to the Chattahoochee River. It's amazing how many of our drugs survive the water reclamation process to affect fish and wildlife, and there's also the concern for children in your home who might get into some old medicine that could hurt them. Major Spellman has committed our police and representatives of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration to come that day and take our old or unneeded drugs for safe disposal. **At the same time, we will be honoring our local public servants, both our police officers and citizens in Berkeley Lake** who volunteer their time to lead homeowner associations and service organizations like the Chapel, BLOSOMS, etc. These people make a huge difference in the life of our community and we are all grateful for the gift of their time and effort. **Drop by for a minute on Saturday, October 28 between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM to celebrate your Hometown Heroes!**

I have arranged for you to be able to **retire old flags properly** by placing them in a box in my office at City Hall. You can leave them there on October 28 or at any time from now on during regular City Hall hours. I will give them into the care of Advanced Disposal which has arranged with the local Boy Scouts to retire them respectfully in accordance with the U. S. Flag Code.

I am communicating with **emergency management** personnel with Gwinnett County to stay current on the possible impact of Hurricane Irma. It is a very strong storm and no one knows at this time exactly where it will go, but it is likely that we will see strong sustained winds and rain late in the weekend or early next week. Please stay alert to the weather. In the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey, the Colonial Pipeline people restarted Line 2 on Monday, September 4 and Line 1 on Tuesday, September 5. So, barring future weather disasters we can expect gas prices to be dropping from the spike we recently saw due to the Harvey interruption.

From time to time we get questions about **animals**. Approximately two years ago, the city adopted the Gwinnett County Animal Control Ordinance that covers domestic pets and livestock because animal control is a service provided throughout the county regardless of municipal jurisdiction boundaries. Enforcement of that ordinance is the responsibility of the Gwinnett County Animal Welfare and Enforcement Unit. The full ordinance may be found at this [link](#). If you have questions about the county ordinance or enforcement, you may speak to an animal control officer by calling 770.339.3200. Complaints or violations should be directed to 770.513.5700. Our City Marshal now only deals with regulations that are specific to Berkeley Lake concerning the keeping of exotic animals and the feeding of wild animals.

Gwinnett’s **Public Safety Fall Festival** might be fun especially for those of you who have kids. It costs nothing and will take place at Coolray Field, 2500 Buford Drive, Lawrenceville on September 23 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Gwinnett’s Police and Fire departments will have “touch-a-truck” for the kids and emergency vehicle displays that include a police helicopter, an ambulance, and a ladder truck. Police will show S.W.A.T. gear, while the fire specialty teams will perform various demonstrations. Animal Welfare and Enforcement will assist with pet adoptions and parents can have their kids’ car seats checked.
